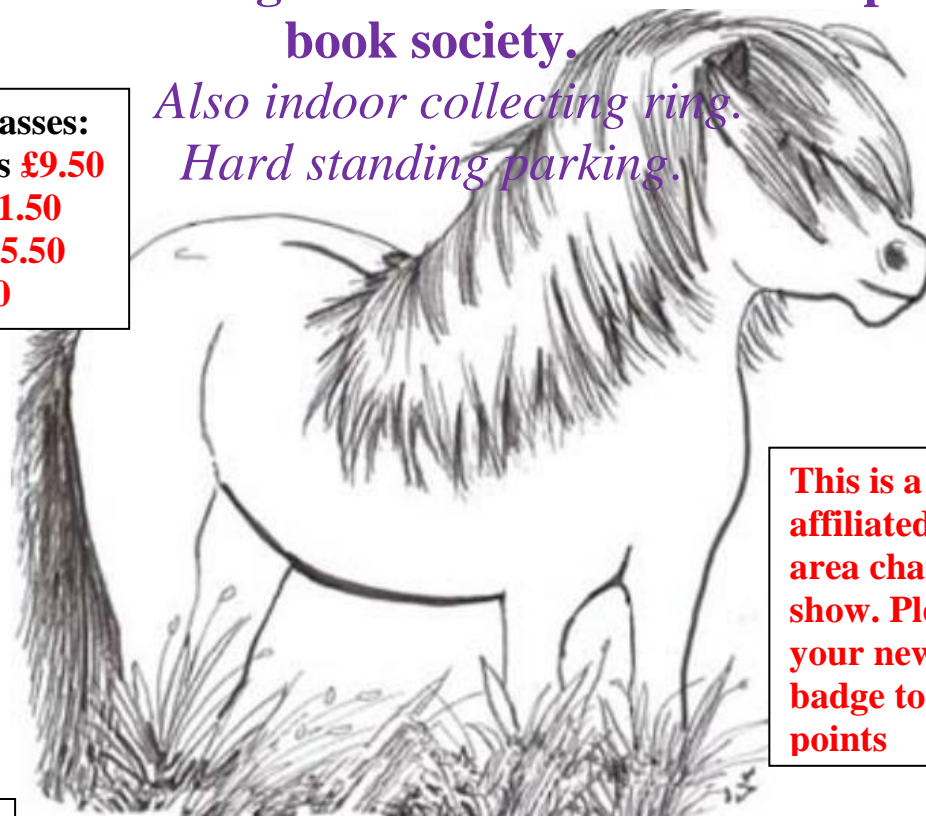

In Hand Classes. 9.30 start Indoor arena

Class 1, Miniature yearlings, colt, filly or gelding. GEMS rosette awarded to the highest place GEMS member.

Class 2, Miniature 2 and 3 year old, colt, filly or gelding. GEMS rosette awarded to the highest place GEMS member.

Miniature Junior Champion. 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 1 & 2.

Class 3, Standard yearlings, colt, filly or gelding.

Class 4, Standard 2 and 3 year old, colt, filly or gelding.

Standard Junior championship. 1st and 2nd prize from classes 3 & 4.

Overall Junior Championship. Miniature and standard junior champions and reserves to compete.

Class 5, Novice pony, open to ponies not to have won more than two 1st prizes prior to the show.

Class 6, Solid colour, open to all solid colours except for Black, any age. GEMS rosette awarded to the highest place GEMS member.

Class 7, Black pony, open to any age, GEMS rosette awarded to the highest place GEMS member.

Class 8, Broken colour, open to piebald, skewbald and tricolour, any age. GEMS rosette awarded to the highest place GEMS member.

Class 9 Home and Island bred, open to any age, for ponies either bred in the Shetland Isles or bred by you.

Lunch break 45 minutes

Class 10, Miniature mare, 4 years old and over, with or without foal at foot. GEMS rosette awarded to the highest place GEMS member.

Class 11, Miniature Stallion, 4 years old and over. GEMS rosette awarded to the highest place GEMS member.

Class 12, Miniature gelding, 4 years old and over. GEMS rosette awarded to the highest place GEMS member.

Miniature Championship. 1st and 2nd prize winners from all miniature classes and 1st and 2nd from all other classes if Miniature.

Class 13, Standard Mare, 4 years old and over, with or without foal at foot.

Class 14, Standard Stallion, 4 years old and over.

Class 15, Standard gelding, 4 years old and over.

Standard Championship. 1st and 2nd prize winners from all standard classes and 1st and 2nd from all other classes if standard.

Class 16, Family connections. Two ponies that are brother & sister, mum & daughter etc. (class not eligible for championship)

Class 17, Veteran pony, open to ponies 15 years old and over.

Senior championship. Open to all 1st and 2nd prize winners over the age of 4 years old.

Best in show.

All champions and reserve to compete.

Class 18, lead rein, rider aged 9 and under on the 1st of January 2023.

Class 19, first ridden, rider aged under 12 years old on the 1st of January 2023.

Class 20, open ridden, rider any age of suitable height and weight.

Class 21, novice ridden, either rider, pony or both.

Ridden championship. All 1st and 2nd prize winners from above classes.

Class 22, young handler. 16 years old and under.

Class 23, Long Rein, to show a short display of skill and control around a set course.

Lunch break

Class 24, Disney themed Fancy dress. Let your imaginations run wild children and adults alike.

Class 25, longest mane and tail, open to all ridden or in hand.

Class 26, pony most like it owner or rider, open to all ridden or in hand.

Class 27, The cheekiest combination, open to all ridden or in hand.

Class 28, egg and spoon race. Open to in hand or ridden.

Class 29, bean bag. Open to in hand or ridden

Class 30, flour jelly baby bobbing race.

E.A.S.P.G. RULES

1. Judge's decision is final.
2. Ridden or driven ponies must be 4 years old or over
3. Children under 14 years of age may not show colts (except foals) or stallions in In hand classes.
4. All handlers aged 14 years and under must wear a British standard hard hat.
5. Young handlers are aged 16 years and under.
6. The E.A.S.P.G and all its show organisers and officials will not be held liable for anything that may happen from any cause or circumstances whatsoever to any person, animals, article or property. Its condition of entry that each exhibitor/competitor shall indemnify the show. Organisers and officials against any such matters aforesaid.
7. Exhibitors/competitors must ensure all their exhibits are covered by their own public liability insurance and complete the declaration on the entry form. Participation at this event deems acceptance of these rules.
8. A judge may not place a pony, which to his/hers knowledge has been sold, leased or produced by the judge or his/her family or employer. Nor may he/she place a pony in which he/she has financial interest, nor place a stallion by which he/she has had a mare stunted in that season. Should a situation arise, a referee should be appointed by the show secretary to place the pony in the class.
9. Affiliated In hand classes are run under S.P.S.B.S. rules (which are posted on the breed society's website www.shetlandponystudbookociety.co.uk). Only pony's registered S.P.S.B.S. may be entered. in affiliated classes. Name and registration number must be shown on entry form and included in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosette must only be given to ponies registered with the society or eligible for registration (ie foals).
10. Lunch break- S.P.S.B.S. panel judge will have an approximately 45 minute break.
11. 3 year old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of 3 weeks old on the day of the show. All entire males aged 2 years and over are advised to display a stallion disc.
12. There must be no colts or entire males in young handler classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in in hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interest of safety, hard must be worn by handlers aged 14 years or under in in hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. In ridden classes if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part. No mobile phones to be used in the ring by exhibitors, stewards or judges.
13. No prize money will be presented.
14. Competitors who enter classes that may coincide to do so at their own risk.
15. No refund of entry fees will be made unless accompanied by a veterinary certificate.
16. The exhibitor is asked to pay for engraving for a perpetual cup or trophy to maintain the cups history. Even if you do not wish to take prize home.
17. SPSBS rules take precedence.
- 18. Only Licensed stallions are eligible for entry to stallion classes.**
- 19. All ponies must have a upto date equine influenza vaccine.**
